National Alumni Association Hall of Fame Induction Criteria

The Hall of Fame Alumni Awards represent an opportunity for Tougaloo College and the National Alumni Association to publicly acknowledge supportive alumni who have distinguished themselves in their respective professions. The Hall of Fame Alumni Committee will select individuals each year based on their contributions and/or successes in either of the following categories: Athletics, Arts, Business, Community Service, Communication, Education, Government and Law, Medicine, Religion and Science. A chapter, individual or self nomination must be submitted by June 30th of the TCNAA end of year calendar.

Individuals inducted into the Hall of Fame will be added to the official list of outstanding alumni to be submitted to organizations such as the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education (NAFEO), National Black College Hall of Fame Foundation, The College Fund/UNCF and others.

The Hall of Fame Committee consists of four staff members of the College, appointed but he President, and six members of the National Alumni Association, appointed by the National Alumni President. Selections of nominees are based on the following criteria:

- 1. Nominee must be an alumnus of Tougaloo College.
- 2. Nominee must have been departed form the College at least ten years.
- 3. Nominee's accomplishments must be documented.
- 4. Nominee's contributions to the College (cash and in-kind services) must be documented.

Nominees must attend the banquet in order to be honored, unless recognized posthumously. Under extenuating circumstances, as determined by the Committee, an award may be presented in absentia.

She graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Sociology in May 1979. The "Tougaloo Experience" would have a lasting impact fostering a commitment and responsibility of community service. Jeannie has a Masters in Managerial Science from Amberton University, Dallas Texas.

Jeannie has been employed with the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) for over thirty years, in resolution management. During her tenure with the FDIC, she has served as financial literary instructor for high school students through the Money Smart Program and mentor in the agency's Mentoring Program. Jeannie continues to impact the lives of others and is currently an Executive Sponsor of Partnership of Women in the Workplace (POWW) and lifetime member of Federally Employed Women (FEW). She is a former volunteer of the New Mount Zion Baptist Church Girls Scout Troop and Scholarship committee. She is also former Board Member of the New Mount Zion Credit Union. She has taught on the secondary school level in the Jackson Public School System and the Vicksburg Public School System. She has also taught on the college level as an instructor at various colleges in the Jackson metropolitan area, including Hinds Community College and Jackson State University. She continues to nurture and to share love for mathematics at Jackson State University where she currently teaches College Algebra.

Ethel has taught at Jackson State University since 1985. During her early teaching career, she pursued and achieved a Master of Science Degree in Mathematics from Jackson State University in 1975. During her 50 plus year career as a teacher, Ethel has taught Geometry, College Algebra, Trigonometry, and Basic Analysis. She has also had a long volunteer teaching career which includes a volunteer tutor at Bethlehem Community Center from 1991-2015. She was the founder of the after-school tutorial program at Triumph Church. She was the lead tutor there from 2010-2016. She currently serves as a volunteer tutor for the Ambassadors of the Evers Academy for African American Males (ATEAAM). Her volunteer teaching career logged thousands of hours. She was honored as the Volunteer of the Year for the ATEAAM for Beta Delta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha and the National Council of Negro Women, Jackson Metro Chapter. Also, she worked as a volunteer with the March of Dimes, Habitat for Humanities, American Cancer Society, and Natchez Trace Estates Neighborhood.

All who know Ethel can attest to her tireless energy and her commitment to helping others. She is actively involved in many community service organizations. She is a member of Beta Delta Omega Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Incorporated, International Community Ambassadors Network (I!CAN), National Coalition of 100 Black Women, National Council of Negro Women, Natchez Trace Estates Neighborhood Block Club, Triumph the Church and Kingdom of God in Christ, NAACP, and Susanna Stitchery Sewing Club. Ethel has always believed in the empowerment of women. The mission of all these organizations is to improve individual lives through community engagement and outreach.

She has held dear to her heart community activism and volunteerism. She has been a volunteer at the Stewpot Kitchen, a local facility that helps to feed its patrons who otherwise would go hungry. She has been a member of the Susanna Stitchery Sewing Club for 17 years. This sewing club provides burial gowns for unfortunate families who lose an infant child. This organization also provides blankets, quilts, gloves, and clothes for the homeless of Gateway Mission Shelter and other local clinics. She is a gifted seamstress and uses her talent to alleviate the suffering of others.

Among her most recent global endeavors include sewing more than 300 jumper dresses which were given to impoverished young girls in Africa. These garments help to continue Ethel's mission to contribute to others. Ethel feels lucky that she has been able to have a positive input on the lives of these children. She feels that she is connected to them through the dresses that they wear. Ethel feels blessed to be able to serve her world-wide community. Truly in giving, she has received more than any of her dress recipients. Ethel is currently making wheel chair bags for those who are wheelchair bound. Ethel enjoys working with people of all ages from children to the elderly.

Ethel's community service does not end with all the above. She is also involved with her immediate surroundings. She has served as treasurer of her neighborhood organization for 34 years, the Natchez Trace-Overlook Estates Block Club. She has helped to provide stability in her neighborhood for over 47 years.

Ethel Gibson is fully committed to her efforts to mentor others. She and her husband provided food and shelter for three young ladies while they were in the Jackson area to further their education. Each young lady received the same love and nurturing as their three daughters. These young ladies are now a doctor/nurse and an elementary school teacher.

She has been able to use her talents to help with several initiatives of her sorority, Alpha Kappa Alpha Incorporated. She has served as the chair of many of her chapter committees including rituals and awards committees. She has also served as the Southeastern Financial Secretary for 4 years. Her chapter has been actively involved and engaged in the community with tutorial programs and other children's welfare initiatives. She has been actively involved and engaged in these programs.

Her church family has also been a tremendous part of Ethel's life. She has been a member of Triumph the Church and Kingdom of God and Christ for over 52 years. She has served as the chairperson for the courtesy committee for several years. She is an avid bridge player and has attained Bronze Life Master.

Ethel is also a life member of the Tougaloo College Alumni Association. She is a proponent of and has supported the efforts of historically black colleges and universities. All three of her children graduated from historically black colleges and universities.

Ethel is multitalented and multidimensional. She is a community activist, teacher, leader, and a follower. She is a well-rounded woman. She is a true community servant.



Sylvia Burkhead Gray

Sylvia Gray is on a mission to help leaders build and grow high performing charter schools. It is this commitment that led her to establish SBGray Start-up Services, a mission driven company that works with school teams to impact student achievement through high quality operations at every level of the organization and underscore the importance of diversity, equity, and inclusion. Trained as an accountant, she has a unique 30-year background in finance and operations management.

Sylvia has worked with the Memphis Business Academy (MBA) team since 2011. Sylvia came on board as the school's first Chief Financial Officer. MBA is one of the largest African-American owned grass roots Charter School Management Organizations (CMO) in the state of Tennessee. During the 2018-19 school year, student enrollment is expected to exceed 1,500 across 6 schools with classes ranging from Pre-K – 12. Sylvia brought a financial strategy to MBA that has allowed the school system to tout phenomenal growth during her tenure. Along with enrollment sustainability, the CMO's growth has been through new construction and purchase/acquisition. Sylvia now works as a Lead Financial Operations Consultant for MBA.

Prior to joining MBA, Sylvia worked in the area of international business as Financial Manager at the Mississippi Consortium for International Development (MCID) in Jackson, Mississippi and as the Assistant Director of International Programs at Mississippi Valley State University (MVSU) located near her hometown of Greenwood in the Mississippi Delta.

While at MVSU, Sylvia advised international students on cultural, personal, academic, and immigration matters. Her role allowed for extensive travel to cultivate the exchange program of the university with countries such as Brazil, Italy, South Africa, and Costa Rica.

Sylvia was the founder and co-leader of the Gateway Leadership Ambassadors Program for domestic and international university student partnerships and exchanges who participated in financial literacy/micro-finance training on the development and implementation of business plans focusing on meeting a community need. She also was the founder and co-leader of the Institute for the Study of Languages and Cultures which focused on the study of critical languages (Mandarin Chinese, Arabic and Russian). The Institute addressed language deficiencies in local elementary schools and allowed for international students of the university to teach foreign languages and cultures to area students. Sylvia's commitment to the International Programs Department at MVSU not only refined her creativity, but it burgeoned her leadership skills. She became a leader for cultural delegations of students who traveled to countries such as France, China, Belize, and Morocco.

In her capacity as Financial Manager for MCID, Sylvia trained foreign project staff members in financial management for international projects which included: African Initiative Textbook and Learning Materials Program, **Zambia**; Enhancing and Sustaining the Roles of Women in **Liberia's** Rebuilding Process; Higher Education and Development; Recovery, Retooling and Revitalizing the University of **Mosul, Iraq**.

Sylvia uses the word "community" to sum up her Tougaloo experience which continued her unique bond with her lifelong sister friends from the Mississippi Delta. Her experience also built relationships with a number of Special Tougalooians more than 30 years ago which exists to this day. A Life Member of the Tougaloo College National Alumni Association (TCNAA), Sylvia became a member of the Memphis Area Tougaloo Alumni Chapter in 2011 and was voted president in 2014. The chapter supports the 1869

Annual Fund and organized its very successful inaugural signature event, "The Bluff City Summer Soulstice Affair" in June 2018. Sylvia is a 2014 alumna of Leadership Memphis, an initiative that prepares and mobilizes leaders to work together for the good of the entire community. Sylvia is a member of Gamma Omicron Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. Sylvia also serves as the accountant for the National Conference of Black Political Scientists representing U.S. Colleges.

A Memphis resident, Sylvia is mother to Brittany, a PhD scholar at Mississippi State University and Amaya, an honor freshman at Xavier University in New Orleans, LA. Sylvia is most proud to stand on the shoulders of her strong and dedicated mother, Lillie Pearl Burkhead, who will turn 88 years old this year.



For more than forty years, Beverly Wade Hogan has skillfully balanced her roles as a wife to Marvin, mother to Maurice and Marcellus and grandmother to the wonderful seven with her roles as the mental health administrator, the government official, the community leader, the educator and the college president. She and her husband of forty-seven years have traveled an incredibly uncommon journey, lined with the rocks of God's amazing grace.

Throughout her distinguished career, she has been remarkably blessed to have engaged in work that mirrored her personal values. Regardless of the monumental challenges, she faced them with enthusiasm and optimism because she had discovered something bigger than herself for which to work. Utilizing her educational preparation in psychology, public policy and administration and human and organizational development, she chartered her own path of progress.

As the mental health executive, she applied her knowledge, skills and passion to establish programs in Mississippi where there were great needs and an equal great void: the first Rape Crisis Center, the first Shelter for Battered Women and the founder of the first psychiatric halfway in Mississippi.

As the government official, she consolidated programs to increase efficiency, effectiveness and collaboration among state agencies. She initiated many programs that improved human conditions: the Self-Employment Demonstration project to reduce welfare dependency; and the Rental Rehabilitation Program and Low Income Tax Credit Program to increase the availability of housing for low-income Mississippians. In affiliation with the German Marshall Fund, she led the team to study education and job training in Germany, Sweden and Denmark.

As the College Administrator, she was the founding director of the George A. and Ruth B. Owens Health, Wellness and Human Resources Center. She is the founder of the Delta HealthPartners Program which was the foundational project on which the Center opened in 1998. It remains a strong component of the Center today.

As the College President, she has worked to build a strong organizational infrastructure to support a top quality academic enterprise, reflecting good stewardship. She has likewise worked to refresh the curriculum with the additions of new undergraduate degree and graduate degree programs and the redesign of the General Education Curriculum, and expand the learning opportunities for students through the new Honors Program, the Center for Undergraduate Research, the Center for International Studies and Global Change and the Institute for the Study of Modern Day Slavery. The Early College High School was launched in August 2018. Significant technological improvements have been made, including campus-wide connectivity, smart classrooms and wireless networks, and major campus renovations, including the architectural transformation of the old Judson Cross into the Blackmon Administration Building, repurposing of the L. Zenobia Coleman Library and the construction of the Bennie G. Thompson Academic and Civil Rights Research Center. Most consequential, she led the effort to bring fiscal stability to the college with the resulting effect of the resolution of the college's indebtedness.

From the introductory remarks of a fellow alumna and mentee in describing President Hogan . . . "Many would call our president an administrator, but I would edit that statement and say she is a teacher who identifies potential in others and directs with patience and persistence. Some may call her a leader, but I would say a trailblazer who makes an indelible mark as the first, as well as paves the way for others to travel. On the other hand, some may call her a woman; yet I would paraphrase and suggest the word nurturer, who births vision even during the most arduous of times. While finally some may say she personifies the "Daughter of the Soil", I'd proclaim she is the Persistent Gardner, one who implants the seed of determination, attends to the fruits through labor, and helps to provide the harvest for all to reap and enjoy".

In 2002, the Tougaloo College Board of Trustees selected Beverly Wade Hogan as the thirteenth president to lead the historic institution.



Rev. Marvin Love, Sr. is a native of Porterville, Mississippi and grew up in DeKalb, Mississippi. He attended Whisenton High School in DeKalb, Mississippi from elementary through the 12th grade, graduating in 1966. Marvin was reared by his grandparents Al and Bettye Love. Although Marvin's grandfather, a very wise man with only a fourth-grade education, stressed the importance of the value of a good education and encouraged Marvin to pursue his academic dreams.

After completing his Associate's degree in 1968 from T.J. Harris Jr. College, Marvin, along with his friend Hayes McClendon, decided to visit their History teacher, Mrs. Noble who asked Hayes where are you going from here. He answered, "Tougaloo College." She turned and asked Marvin the same question and he answered, "I don't know but I am applying to different colleges." Upon hearing that, Mrs. Noble recommended that since Hayes had a basketball scholarship to Tougaloo College that he should ask for a tryout. She also encouraged Hayes to write and say that he had a friend who would like to attend Tougaloo College. This turned out to be wise advice because Marvin was accepted at Tougaloo College and awarded a full scholarship.

Marvin has fond memories of growing up on the farm in DeKalb, Mississippi, but did not have the funds to attend college anywhere. "Earning a scholarship to Tougaloo College was a blessing that allowed me the chance to get a college degree. I am forever indebted to Tougaloo College, and no matter what I do, it will not be enough to give back." Marvin is the first in his family to receive a college education. In 1970, Marvin graduated from Tougaloo College with a B.A in Health and Physical Education. While at Tougaloo College, he played basketball and baseball. He was also initiated into the Rho Epsilon Chapter of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.


Marvin is the son of Leroy Love and Alice Farmer. He is married to Barbara Ann Hubbard Love since 1972. They have three children: Felicia, Christie, and Marvin II. They are the proud grandparents of three granddaughters Erin, Micah, and Camryn Love. They are honored to have a daughter-in-law, Crystal Love and son-in-law, Tony Runnels. Marvin also has 15 living brothers and sisters.

Rev. Marvin Love, Sr. is a veteran of the U.S. Army where he spent two years. While serving in the U.S. Army, he was the first Black soldier of the month for his unit. In 1972, he was awarded the Army Commendation Medal for meritorious service with U.S. Army Aviation Test Board, Fort Rucker, Alabama. Additionally, Marvin coached the football team to become the Post champions and the softball team to the playoffs.

Rev. Love is a great man of faith who accepted Jesus Christ as his Lord and Savior at the age of 13 at the Pleasant Grove Missionary Baptist Church in Dekalb. While living in Houston Marvin attended Hopewell Baptist Church for many years under the leadership of Dr. Asa W. Sampson Sr. While attending Hopewell, he confessed his call to the ministry. Three years ago, Rev. Marvin Love accepted the call to pastor the Unity in God Baptist Church. Pastor Love has a Certificate of License as a Gospel Preacher and a Certificate of Ordination in the Gospel Ministry.

Professionally, Rev. Love has 44 years of management in retail with Kmart and Family Dollar. During his career years, he earned the Certificate for Store Manager at Family Dollar. Marvin's additional professional affiliations include: Baptist Ministers Association of Houston and Vicinity, South Texas District Association, Mason, and USA Track & Field Official.

Marvin is a dedicated and committed member of the Houston Area Tougaloo College Alumni Chapter. He is a charter member of the Chapter where he has served as Vice President and now currently the Treasurer. He has been a Lifetime Member of the TCNAA since 1992. Marvin says, "I thank God for my fellow Alumni in Houston for nominating me to be inducted into the National Alumni Hall of Fame." As a man of faith, Marvin lives by the words: Trust in the Lord with all thine heart. Proverbs 3:5.



Dr. Rosie Walker-McNair was born in Clinton, Mississippi to the late Frank Walker, and Rosie Mae Walker. I was the seventh of nine children. I was reared in Jackson, Mississippi. I attended the Jackson Public Schools and graduated from Oscar H Wingfield High school.

I was first introduced to Tougaloo College by my 9th grade English teacher, Mrs. Barbara Hilliard, who made it clear that she "wanted her homeroom students to attend Tougaloo College". During my junior year at Wingfield, while trying to decide what I was going to do for the summer, I browsed a bulletin board which advertised a program for Minorities interested in Health careers. This program was offered at Tougaloo College. Dr Richard McGinnis was the director, and he quickly accepted my application. This program was the beginning of my life journey and love for Tougaloo College. The experience that I received during that summer program inspired me to return to Tougaloo after high school graduation. Upon my high school graduation, Dr. Richard McGinnis accepted me into a mentoring program that allowed students to shadow and work alongside a health professional. I was placed in Dr. Robert Smith's clinic on Winter Street. There, I was exposed to black doctors and other health professionals working in various health care roles. In fall of 1974, I walked through the gates of Tougaloo as a Presidential Scholar majoring in Biology with a strong interest in Psychology. Dr. Robert Smith allowed me, along with other Tougaloo students to continue to work in his office as we matriculated through college. After working in the clinic for one year, I wanted to attend medical school. It was during my third year, that Dr. Richard McGinnis recommended me for the Brown's Early Identification Program for medical school. I graduated summa cum laud in Biology in May 1981.

I entered Brown University in fall of 1981, and graduated from Brown University in 1985. After graduation, I entered an internship in Internal Medicine at the UMC of Mississippi. After completing my internship, I served two years with the National Health Service Corp, working in the Jackson Hinds Comprehensive Utica Clinic, and School Based clinics. In 1988, I moved to Baltimore, Maryland and completed my Internal Medicine residency at the Franklin Square Hospital Center.

I returned to Mississippi in 1992, and began working at Family Health Care Center in Brandon. In 1998, I along with Dr. Yolanda Wilson, opened Magnolia Medical Group which offered primary care to both adults and children. In 2013, I returned to Jackson Hinds Comprehensive Health Center, Bennie G. Thompson Health Facility, Woodrow Wilson Avenue, Jackson, Mississippi, This facility offers health care services to the public.

I have been married to Dr. Obie M. McNair, since 1985. We have two children: Obie Scott McNair, a 2012, Tougaloo graduate, and Jasmine McNair, a 2017 graduate of Tuskegee University.

I was a member of the Jackson Chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Incorporation for 15 years. This is one of the oldest black family-oriented civic organizations in America. It enjoys a rich history of providing educational, cultural, recreational and civic opportunities for all children. As an active working mother, I was able to raise my children in a village of other mothers who worked together to produce leaders for the future.

In 1978, while a student at Tougaloo College, I became a member of the Gamma Psi Chapter of Delta Sigma Delta Sorority, Inc. I have continued my membership in the Madison County (MS) Alumnae Chapter. This membership has allowed me to use my training and knowledge by Co-Chairing the Physical and Mental Health Committee, as well as the Project-13 Committee. I have also worked with the Delta Academy and Delta GEMS which focus on mentoring Middle and High School girls. I have also worked with Social Action and International Awareness Committee. As an active member of the Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. I have volunteered with the Salvation Army Ringing the Bell fund raiser, Breast Cancer Walk, and Multiple Sclerosis Walk, and Cure Sickle Cell Walk.

I am a member of the Morning Star Baptist Church since 1986, where I worked with the Youth and Drama Ministries. I currently serve as a Sunday school teacher for the co-ed Adult Class and Assistant teacher for our Wednesday night Bible Study. As a member of the Nurse's Assistance Ministry, I have served in various roles, namely, assisted in organizing Health Fairs and hosting Health Seminars. I also am a volunteer for the Children's Nursery.

My philosophy in life is to use whatever gift one has been blessed with and strive to make the community in which you live a better place. This is reflected in my favorite Baptist hymn, "if I can help somebody along the way, then my living will not be in vain."

Little did I know that she would go on to become President of Tougaloo College, "The Eagle Queen", at one of its most important junctures in history, building on Tougaloo's mission of academic excellence and freedom. Dr. Hogan would improve the institution's infrastructure and produce graduates of local, state, and global significance.


